Road Closures

ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984, TEMPORARY CLOSURE OF HOLT ROAD, THREE LEGGED CROSS

EMERGENCY TEMPORARY CLOSURE OF UNNAMED ROAD, CHALBURY COMMON DORSET COUNCIL BT have notified us of an urgent closure at Junction On B3078 At Sybil Cottages Via Chalbury Hill To Chalbury Lane Horton, to access underground BT structure to restore service. The works are expected to be completed

by 28-10-2025.

TEMPORARY TRAFFIC MANAGEMENT ORDER, VERWOOD ROAD, WOODLANDS

DORSET COUNCIL has made an Order under Section 14 [1] of the Road Traffic Regulations Act 1984 as amended. The Order is needed in order to comply with health and safety regulations which require the provision of safe working areas and to minimise the likelihood of danger to highway users. It will come into operation on 13 November 2025 and remains in force for 18 months however it is anticipated that the works will be completed by 17 November 2025. The works will take place between 0800 and 1800 and will be reopened to traffic overnight. This Order will enable Dorset Council to carry out carriageway maintenance and resurfacing works. The effect of this Order is as follows: [i] To impose a temporary road closure on; Verwood Road, Woodlands as indicated by signs on site. [ii] To impose a temporary clearway and parking suspension as indicated by signs on site to prevent waiting or parking on the highway along Verwood Road, Woodlands. A locally signed diversion route will be put in place to enable traffic to travel around the closed sections.

TEMPORARY CLOSURE OF KINGS LANE, WOODLANDS

DORSET COUNCIL has issued a Notice under Section 14 [2] of the Road Traffic Regulations Act 1984 as amended. All vehicles, cyclists and horse riders will be prohibited from proceeding along Kings Lane, Woodlands between Bagmans Lane and Fairview, a distance of approximately 770 metres. The Notice is needed in order to comply with health and safety regulations which require the provision of safe working areas and to minimise likelihood of danger to highway users. It will come into operation between 09:30 16:00 on 11th November 2025 and remain in force for five days, however it is anticipated that the works will be completed by 11th November 2025. This Notice will enable Openreach safe access to carry out pole and cable installation works in the highway. The alternative route, which will be sign posted is as follows: B3078 - C2 - C76.

Temporary Traffic Regulation Order for Verwood Road, Woodlands

Dorset Council will be carrying out a traditional resurfacing programme to targeted and localised repairs between 1^{st} and 5^{th} December and the road will be closed from 09:00 - 16:00 hours.

Recent Actions & Developments

Until 31st October Dorset Council could show a land supply of 5.02 years, currently a new position has not been published but is likely to be around 2.5 years. This has a number of effects on Planning Decisions.

1. The "presumption in favour of sustainable development"

Under the National Planning Policy Framework (NPPF), if a council cannot demonstrate a 5-year supply, the presumption in favour of sustainable development (paragraph 11 d) applies.

This means:

- The local plan's housing policies (and often related settlement boundaries) are treated as out-of-date.
- Decision-makers must approve development proposals unless:
 - 1. Adverse impacts would significantly and demonstrably outweigh the benefits, or
 - 2. Specific protective policies apply (e.g. Green Belt, AONB, heritage designations, nutrient neutrality, etc.).

For Dorset, much of East Dorset is not Green Belt, so the presumption could apply strongly outside settlements.

2. More approvals for "unallocated" or edge-of-settlement sites

Without a 5-year supply:

- Developers can promote sites not allocated in the local plan.
- Dorset Council will find it harder to refuse such applications if they deliver housing, even if contrary to settlement boundaries.
- Inspectors often allow appeals unless there are clear, site-specific harms (e.g., landscape, access, ecology).

This increases pressure on villages and towns like Alderholt, Verwood, Ferndown and Wimborne.

3. Appeals become more developer-friendly

- Planning inspectors routinely allow appeals where the council lacks a 5-year supply, citing paragraph 11 d of the NPPF.
- Dorset Council could face higher appeal costs and resource strain defending refusals.
- Recent appeals in East Dorset show developers using the lack of 5-year supply as a key argument to overturn refusals.

4. Reduced weight to local policies

When the supply is under 5 years:

- Housing-related local plan policies (e.g., those restricting development outside settlements) carry limited weight.
- Other policies (design, heritage, flood risk, landscape, ecology) still apply, but the planning balance tilts toward approval if a site is "sustainable."

5. Council strategy implications

- Dorset Council must now **accelerate housing delivery** and site allocations in the forthcoming Local Plan to recover a 5-year supply.
- It may **update its Annual Position Statement early in 2026** if new completions or permissions improve the trajectory.
- Meanwhile, decision-making committees will need to document planning balances carefully to avoid losing appeal.
